◆ The **Eastern Mediterranean International School** at Hakfar Hayarok, consists of 20% Israelis, 20% Palestinians, and 60% Internationals. The students learn and live together and are steeped in the values of respect, diversity and global citizenship. Learn more at em-is.org.

◆ In 2009, Israeli Edna Fast, through her non-profit **LunArt**, began offering a free college prep course for Arab-Israeli high school graduates who wanted to pursue art and who needed professional help to increase their chances in the competitive college admission process.
